

IOHA Collaboration Award Criteria and Judgment Process

1. Criteria for evaluation

Every member of the IOHA Collaboration Award jury evaluates the submitted projects on a 3-point scale for all criteria.

The collaboration project will be judged on the following criteria:

- Size of the population that is directly involved and reached/impacted by this project (small =1; medium =2; large=3).
- Originality of the topic and methodologies used within this project to enhance collaboration (1=standard methodologies; 2=new methodologies; 3= out of the box, innovative methodologies)
- Level of inspiration for other occupational hygienists worldwide (1= the project is ok; 2= the project is nice; 3= the project is excellent, and this should be done everywhere)
- Direct /impact on working conditions in the country where project has been carried out.
(1= no or minor changes will be realised; 2= some changes will be made; 3 = changes are clear)
- Level of collaboration between the parties (1= collaboration just for once; 2= collaboration on a few occasions; 3= long term continuity)
- Level of continuity for the future; can we promote this project as a good practise for Cooperation, did the cooperation led to sustainable improvement/s (1= low, 2= average, 3 = high)
- How well is the project in line with IOHA strategy 2021-2025; especially strategic goal “strong network”; (1= not at all or just a little; 2 = partly; 3= completely)
- Quality of three-minute video which tells the story of the collaboration (1= neutral, 2= good, 3=very good)

2. Calculation score

The projects will be judged on all eight criteria. Every member of the jury awards between 1 – 3 points for each criterion.

The project with the highest score will win the Collaboration Award

If two or more projects end with the same score, the project with the highest score for originality will win.

3. Composition of the jury

The jury is composed of a minimum of three and maximum of five IOHA board members. Board members that represent a country that has been nominated and submitted a project shall be excluded from the jury.
